

The All Is One - *A philosophical political social satire.*

feature film, directed by Tobias Schönenberg, Germany 2023, 81 min. (MPAA Rated G – all ages)

The All Is One is a feature film by director Tobias Schönenberg and screenwriter Hilal Sezgin and was created based on an idea by Bobby Holzinger as part of the actor further training “Für den Film” with 53 actors and the goal of creating equally sized roles for everyone involved. The film was produced by Bobby Holzinger Filmproduktion GmbH, including funding from the German “Agentur für Arbeit”. No animals were tortured or killed in the making of the film. Any proceeds from the marketing of the film will be used exclusively for charitable purposes. A sequel with the working title **One For All** is already being planned.

After the world premiere in Mexico in 2023, the film was invited to film festivals in Austria, Argentina, Brazil, Canada, China, Ecuador, England, Finland, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, New Zealand, Poland, Switzerland, Turkey, the USA and Venezuela.

The film had its German premiere in May 2023 at the 20th Neisse Film Festival.

The All Is One received the rating “valuable” from the German Film and Media Rating (FBW) and has been honored with numerous nominations and awards at film festivals around the world.

Director Tobias Schönenberg also received an award for “Best Director” from the Makkho International Film Festival (India) and actor Martin Timmy Habberger received an award for “Best Actor” from the Toronto Beaches Film Festival (Canada).

The theatrical release in Germany was on May 16, 2024. Since then, the film has been shown permanently in selected German-speaking cinemas via the German film distributor Drop-Out Cinema.

Synopsis

Slaughterhouse owner Werner Haas has a ton of slaughter waste dumped on his front lawn in the middle of the night. Fuming mad, he files charges against unknown persons and foolishly sets something in motion that can't be stopped.

The All Is One - oh, really?

- Around 53.2 million pigs were slaughtered in German slaughterhouses in 2019.
- **The All Is One** is a feature film with 53 roles of equal size.
- **The All Is One** centers around the question of why we humans still eat meat.

Director's Statement - Tobias Schönenberg

“This film centers around the question of why we humans still eat meat. The German Animal Welfare Act turned fifty years old in 2022. It states that vertebrates may only be killed for justifiable reasons. I think that aspect alone is grounds for heated debate. In this film we refrain from indulging in the visual horror of the slaughterhouse, and instead, opt for a delightful, articulate, human ensemble. My hope is that the many varied opinions expressed in the film inspire fiery debate.”

The film music was composed and recorded by hackedepicciotto (Alexander Hacke/ Danielle de Picciotto) for the already finished film. It is a single piece of music that accompanies the entire film without a break. The ending song is also by hackedepicciotto. It takes up the theme of the film music once again.

The All Is One - Critical reception

A cinematic experiment on the topic of meat consumption - consistently conceived and implemented. Unsuspecting anything bad, the operator of the local slaughterhouse opens his front door one morning - and finds a huge pile of slaughterhouse waste in his garden. The police is called, the press is alarmed. And it really could have been anyone in the village. The satirical feature film deals with a highly topical subject

in a dryly humorous way - with a wink and without a moral finger. It is an important, topical, and sensitive subject that the feature film, directed by Tobias Schöenberg (based on an idea by producer Tobby Holzinger), tackles. Almost everyone has an opinion about eating meat. The film adapts this perspective in a consistent way by filming many protagonists in an interrogation situation like a chamber play. This creates many absurd, entertaining, funny, and serious moments. As the second plot line, the film accompanies the volunteer Emily in her talks with local politicians. And this is where all the helplessness and mendacity of the system come to the fore, showing us how profit and greed are taking the place where common sense and empathy should prevail. The film project was set up as part of the acting workshop "FÜR DEN FILM" with more than 50 actors thanks to the commitment of the coaches, lecturers and everyone involved in the workshop. A remarkable achievement. Without being explicitly an experimental film, THE ALL IS ONE works as a cinematic experiment, as a mirror for the audience, which can deal with a colorful bouquet of opinions and reflect on their own attitude.

- **Filmbewertungsstelle Wiesbaden (FBW)**

The owner of a slaughterhouse in a small town in Lower Saxony alerted the police because slaughterhouse waste was dumped in his front yard at night. The policewoman and her colleague begin investigating and questioning possible witnesses in the neighborhood and in the slaughterhouse; then animal welfare activists are systematically interrogated. In doing so, they encounter few concrete indications, but many strong opinions about slaughterhouses and meat eating in general. Meanwhile, a dedicated volunteer from the local newspaper is beginning to take a critical look at the planned expansion of the slaughterhouse and to sound out various authorities. The crime plot only serves as a hook and framework for an ensemble satire conveyed via the dialogues about the pleasure and frustration of eating animals, the German meat industry, and different attitudes towards it. The production relies on a pointed screenplay and an excellently performing ensemble - a discourse carnage that is as enjoyable as it is thought-provoking and all about the sensitive topic of meat consumption.

In Tobias Schöenberg's mix of satire, chamber play, drama and local crime, the police work their way through countless interrogation situations. The reason: slaughterhouse waste was dumped in the garden of the local slaughterhouse operator. What follows is a crazy parade of villagers and animal welfare activists, all of whom have their own opinions on the subject of meat consumption and meat management. And express this in sometimes exhausting monologues. Nevertheless: "The All Is One" is entertaining, witty and astonishing in its reduction and staging simplicity.

"The All Is One" tells the story of a small village community that one day becomes uneasy. Because suddenly slaughterhouse waste appears in the front garden of the slaughterhouse operator, Werner Haas. A nighttime operation by confused criminals or the act of angry animal rights activists? Outraged, Haas

files a complaint against unknown persons, which triggers a police investigation. And while the police are carrying out their investigation, a dedicated volunteer at the local newspaper comes across suspicious events in connection with the expansion of the slaughterhouse operation.

With charm and tongue-in-cheek humor, director Tobias Schönenberg talks about the ongoing controversial issue of meat consumption in "The All Is One". Including the different perspectives on this complex subject, which includes ethical questions as well as the aspects of animal welfare, "humane" slaughter, meat avoidance, vegetarianism and the meat industry in its entirety. So these are hot topics that Schönenberg brings to the table.

He decides to deal with all these contents and questions not only in a satirical and exaggerated manner, but also in a dialogue-rich and eloquent manner. The crime story about the incident with the slaughterhouse waste only serves as a pretext to set in motion a chamber play-like ensemble piece, which consists almost entirely of questioning and interview scenes. First, the two (somewhat jaded) police officers question the villagers about the recent events. The different views and opinions are already evident here in the form of smug, sometimes wonderfully exaggerated and mischievous remarks and comments.

Passionate meat eaters as well as vegetarians and vegans who are critical of the slaughterhouse have their say. Then the scene changes to the slaughterhouse, where the officials ask the employees (the engravers, beaters, cutters and cleaners) questions. And finally the action shifts to the third core setting: the police station. Animal rights activists have their say here. Schönenberg thus offers all parties and sides a platform without clearly positioning himself. It's worth mentioning that the film only needs a few scenes to give some of the supporting characters a surprising amount of depth - although their appearances usually last no longer than a few minutes. And there are indeed many supporting characters that Schönenberg introduces.

The wealth of dialogue and the immense contributions of words, which are sometimes bombarded at the viewer at high speed, also require the viewer to concentrate and be willing to fully engage with this thematic wealth and range of arguments. Slight signs of fatigue cannot be ruled out after at least an hour of continuous interrogation.

In the end, it is primarily the local politicians and, to be fair, the leaden, paralyzing bureaucracy that comes off badly. Be it the veterinary office, local council, food inspection, expert or trade inspectorate: almost all positions and offices turn out to be error-prone, overloaded, overwhelmed or for sale.
